The sustainability practices outlined in this guide and used in Eversource's supply chain allow us to assign scores to suppliers so that we can track progress, monitor trends, and create sustainable supply chain goals. Results of our supplier engagements on sustainability are also described in our Annual Sustainability Report that many of our key stakeholders, including investors, use to learn about Eversource's sustainability performance. By proactively addressing emerging stakeholder expectations, suppliers can adapt over time rather than all at once.

Eversource's Supplier Sustainability Program

Eversource's Supplier Sustainability Program strategy is comprised of four steps allowing us to engage with our suppliers for responsible sourcing by using the sustainability data in bid evaluations, supplier relationship meetings, and annual goals.

I. Supplier Data Inputs: As the relationship between Eversource and our suppliers progresses, our expectations for suppliers' practices do as well:



- II. Review: Using the data from Supplier inputs, we can identify opportunities
- **III. Plan:** Eversource has numerous reports that we use to monitor Supplier Sustainability and plan for improvements
- **IV. Improve**: Focusing on areas identified for improvement, Eversource will work with specific suppliers to develop improvement plans and track performance

Suppliers Data Inputs

1.1 Sustainability Practices that Supplier Employs – SPQ and Bid Process

The information that is collected within the Supplier Profile Questionnaire and during the bid process in Ariba provides a summarized look at a supplier's sustainability practices. This question is asked during supplier registration in the SPQ and is also asked again during the bid process where suppliers have the opportunity to update any progress. Once the supplier has set baseline responses to this question, the previous response will pre-populate for any future bids that the supplier participates in. If the supplier chooses to update during the bid process, this will automatically update the response in their organizational profile, which is where the supplier sustainability profile data is stored. The scores that procurement assigns to each vendor based on their response (along with the Eversource Sustainability Opportunity question (4.2), provide a sustainability score for the RFP Evaluation. Whenever a supplier updates their response, their score will be revised accordingly.

1.2.1 Examples of Opportunities

The following table provides examples of opportunities that you as the supplier can consider working with Eversource to implement. These opportunities are **examples** to help you think of an opportunity that would benefit the bid in question. You are encouraged to think outside the box to come up with opportunities. This may be something that your company has done with other customers or a new pilot! You can work with your procurement agent if you would like assistance. Most of these opportunities provide both sides with savings and may help your company become more sustainable if you choose to adopt the opportunity as a standard practice!

Sustainable Waste Management Practices	 For contract duration, supplier agrees to reuse containers/pallets/reels that materials are being delivered with and reuse them for future deliveries Reuse of excess or removed material from site Develop circular business models (use of recycled materials in production, eliminating consumables, designing for extended use, etc.)

1.3 Annual Sustainability Questionnaire

Eversource Procurement targets vendors who comprise our top 70% of spend to complete an additional detailed Annual Sustainability Questionnaire, which is sent out as an RFI in Ariba Sourcing. The questionnaire

consists of "Yes/No" and multiple-choice questions regarding Environmental, Labor and Human Rights, Code of Conduct, and Safety. The information collected:

- Provides an in-depth look at our top Suppliers sustainability practices
- Provides Eversource targeted areas to improve our overall Supplier Sustainability Performance
- Gives individual Suppliers targeted areas to improve their Sustainability Performance
- The Annual Sustainability Questionnaire results in standardized benchmark scores for all key suppliers during the annual SRM review

1.4 The Sustainability Project (TSP) Questionnaire

Eversource is also a member of the Electric Utility Industry Sustainable Supply Chain Alliance (EUISSCA). We ask our Supplier Relationship Management (SRM) suppliers to participate in their annual Sustainability Questionnaire through TSP. This questionnaire is very detailed and provides a score for suppliers to track their progress and compare scores against industry peers to benchmark performance. Eversource currently targets our SRM suppliers to complete this questionnaire, but any suppliers interested in participating in the survey to improve their sustainability performance are welcome to participate.
